




FTA & Services

- Guarantees right of U.S. service providers to compete in Colombia on a level playing field.
- Eliminates requirement to establish a branch in order to provide service.
- Eliminates penalties on U.S. companies for terminating agreements with local commercial agents.



FTA & Government Procurement



- Non-discriminatory treatment for bidding on wide range of national, regional governments and state-owned enterprises.
- Requires the use of transparent, predictable, and fair procedures for conducting procurements.


Davivienda is a Colombian financial institution with operations in 6 countries and is part of Sociedades Bolivar.
