Of Note:

How Much Did US Imports of Different Products Change after Trump's Tariffs?: Writing in the Peterson Institute for International Economics' *Realtime Economics*, Gary Clyde Hufbauer and Ye Zhang conclude President Trump's "cascade of new tariffs" had the opposite impact of their intention: the data show that imports surged in the first half of 2025, whereas exports declined in the same period. Real exports of most major products decreased by varying percentages between April-July 2024 and April-July 2025, an unforeseen consequence of the higher cost or lessened availability of intermediate inputs as a result of Trump's tariffs.

USMCA Chapter 19 Digital Trade: Executive Report and 2026 Review Outlook: Policy Recommendations for North America's Digital And Ai Integration: an initiative of the Inter-American Dialogue's Mexico Program, it presents key insights for North America's digital and AI integration, building on the work of the USMCA Digital Trade and AI Task Force. 'Ugly' Fees on Chinese Ships Concern US Ag Exporters: The now-paused fees on Chinese ships docking at U.S. ports are a misguided attempt to revitalize U.S. maritime fortunes at the expense of American exporters, said Peter Freidmann, executive director of the Agriculture Transportation Coalition, in an interview with <u>FreightWaves</u>. While other carriers shifted ships and tweaked services to minimize their exposure, published reports said Cosco of China and Hong Kong subsidiary OOCL paid approximately \$42 million just in the first week after the fees went into effect Oct. 14. Analysts estimated that the China lines could be liable for as much as \$1.5 billion in fees in 2026.

FDI Fuels Chip Shift: McKinsey & Company's <u>The Week in Charts</u> notes, as geopolitical tensions rise, countries and companies are moving to diversify production beyond Taiwan and South Korea and bring manufacturing closer to home. In this context, foreign direct investment (FDI) is emerging as a key driver of global capacity growth. In fact, FDI could bolster the United States' capacity, potentially making it the second-largest producer of leading-edge semiconductors by the early 2030s. A chart describes how FDI in semiconductors reconfigured sharply toward the U.S. between 2022-25.

After Months of Turmoil, China–U.S. Blank Sailings Settle Down: Citing new data from project44, Supply Chain 24/7 notes that after months of spikes tied to tariff changes, carriers appear to be settling into new trade patterns as demand levels out. Blank sailings between China and the U.S. are down sharply from their peak in the spring. project44 reports an 82% drop from April's high point, a sign that carriers adjusted too far earlier in the year as importers rushed to move goods before new tariffs took effect.

Provide Input on the American AI Exports Program: The Department of Commerce recently announced the implementation of the American AI Exports Program. The Program will select industry-led export packages that will include AI hardware, software, models, and applications across industry sectors for promotion to countries and regions around the world. To help us shape the Program, understand industry needs, and ensure that policy outcomes are met, the Commerce Department has published a Request for Information (RFI) in the Federal Register and launched the aiexports.gov site. U.S. and global technology companies are encouraged to review the notice and consider submitting comments by the November 28, 2025, deadline.

Navigating Cross-border Freight in an Era of Uncertainty: As reported in *Supply Chain Dive*, this new playbook shows how the right partner helps shippers build resilient cross-border strategies, with real-world insights from industry peers and experts. This playbook examines the root causes of volatility in cross-border logistics and highlights best practices for mitigating risk through strategic carrier partnerships.

Digital Innovation Key to Expanding Trade Prospects for Small Businesses: During a meeting of the WTO's Informal Working Group on Micro, Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (MSMEs), Deputy Director-General Xiangchen Zhang observed that trade digitalization and support for digital entrepreneurship represent low-hanging fruits for increasing access to international markets for small businesses. DDG Zhang cited the results of a 2023 survey showing that two-thirds of businesses intend to expand internationally, and 80% of micro entrepreneurs are already selling to more than one economy.

Ranked: The 30 Largest Importers in the World: No surprises on the <u>Visual Capitalist graphic</u>: America, China, and Germany were the world's largest importers of goods in 2024. More than 13% of the world's imported goods are purchased by America, equaling \$3.4 trillion of the \$20.4 trillion the top 30 countries imported in 2024. Meanwhile, China imported \$2.6 trillion in goods, ranking second globally.

Even as Global Uncertainty Surges, Economic Sentiment Remains Positive: In a recent <u>IMF Blog</u>, their <u>Chart of the Week</u> shows that a recent record monthly level for policy uncertainty was accompanied by relatively upbeat readings for their World Sentiment Index – echoing recent IMF forecasts that the global economy remains resilient and is slowing only modestly. This resilience can be attributed to improved policies, especially in emerging markets, alongside better business adaptability – but elevated uncertainty may be a new normal.

Survey: Logistics Pros Turn to Tech amid Trade Turbulence: Logistics professionals expect to see the current volatile trade environment continue for the next five years and are looking to technology for help, according to the "Ninth Annual Forwarder/Broker Benchmark Study" from the logistics technology firm Descartes. As reported in *Supply Chain Xchange*, the report, which was released last week, is based on responses from 434 freight forwarders and custom brokers from around the world.

Panama Canal Fights Drought with \$8.5B Plan to Secure Future Trade: As reported in *FreightWaves*, the Panama Canal Authority is implementing an \$8.5 billion, 10-year modernization plan to enhance its competitiveness, expand capacity, and ensure water resilience amidst evolving global trade patterns and climate pressures. This plan includes constructing two new container terminals (Corozal and Telfers) to add significant annual capacity, a \$4 billion liquefied petroleum gas pipeline to free up canal slots, and a \$1.2 billion Río Indio reservoir project to address water dependence.

Mapped: The Global Cost of Living Index 2025: The <u>Visual Capitalist</u> graphically displays Numbeo's Global Cost of Living Index that measures the price of goods, services, and rent relative to New York City (baseline of 100). Traditional wealth hubs like Switzerland and Singapore are the most expensive, while South Asian nations like India, Pakistan, and Bangladesh are the cheapest.

The World's \$111 Trillion in Government Debt, in One Giant Chart: Just when you thought Halloween was over, *Visual Capitalist* publishes this.

Unsteady Ground: Global Economic Outlook 2025–2027: 2H 2025: Recently released by Kearney's Global Policy Council, this <u>report</u> offers an overview of the refreshed global economic data through 2027 and looks at the trends underpinning changes to the foundations of the macroeconomy. This includes an assessment of significant changes to economic policy, a look at emerging complications related to geoeconomic fragmentation, an analysis of trade trends and their industry implications, and AI's emergence as an economic wildcard.

Ranked: The World's Largest Economies in 2026: The Visual Capitalist presents this fascinating graphic on the projected size of world economies in 2026. The American economy is expected to reach \$31.8 trillion in GDP by 2026. This is roughly the size of China (2nd - \$20.6 trillion), Germany (3rd - \$5.3 trillion), and India (4th - \$4.5 trillion) combined.

Prime Time for Cargo Theft: \$18M Vanishing Every Day: As reported in <u>Overdrive</u> (and elsewhere), a <u>new report</u> from the American Transportation Research Institute (ATRI) reveals the true costs and impacts of cargo theft. Annualized cost to trucking ATRI pegged at a whopping \$6.6 billion – more than \$18 million per day. Motor carrier respondents to an ATRI survey that underlies data in the report showed more than \$16M of cargo losses in 555 separate incidents during 2023, with an average loss per incident of around \$29,000. For brokers and other LSPs the issue is even more stark: \$33 million reported lost by survey respondents in 2023, with an average loss of nearly \$100K per theft.

DHL: Global Trade Has Flourished even as U.S. Tariffs Rocked American Trade: A study from DHL and New York University's Stern School of Business reveals global trade grew faster in the first half of 2025 than in any half-year since 2010, excluding the pandemic rebound. Overall, the study concluded that global trade is projected to keep growing, forecasting a 2.5% annualized growth rate in global trade volumes from 2025 to 2029—roughly matching the pace of the previous decade.

Ranked: The World's Top 30 Countries by Exports: The <u>Visual Capitalist</u> ranks the world's biggest exporters. China accounted for 14.6% of global exports of goods in 2024, the highest share overall. Vietnam, Hong Kong SAR, and France each saw double-digit export growth, while exports contracted the sharpest in Australia. Despite being a primary target of U.S. tariffs, China has deepened trade ties across Africa, Southeast Asia, and Europe in 2025.

Global Trade Outlook and Statistics: The just released and updated October 2025 edition forecast for world merchandise trade volume growth in 2025 has risen to 2.4% (up from the estimate of 0.9% in the interim outlook in August) while the outlook for 2026 has deteriorated to 0.5% (down from the August estimate of 1.8%). The forecast for services trade has also been updated, with commercial services export volume now expected to grow 4.6% in 2025 and 4.4% in 2026, up slightly from the previous estimates last April.

The FDI Shake-up: How Foreign Direct Investment Today May Shape Industry and Trade Tomorrow: McKinsey Global Institute has published a report on what foreign direct investment (FDI) can tell us about global industry in the future. This report explores the shifts underway in FDI and offers foresight for decision-makers as they navigate a high-stakes environment of intensifying economic competition and shifting geopolitical dynamics. 2025 Kearney Reshoring Index: After enjoying two consecutive years of continued momentum, <u>Kearney's Reshoring Index</u> faced its first significant drop in 2024, raising fundamental questions about the sustainability of the upward trajectory of U.S. manufacturing witnessed in recent years. Despite substantial investment in domestic production capacity, manufacturing gross output (MGO) has been virtually flat since early 2023.

China's Economic Transition: Debt, Demography, Deglobalization, and Scenarios for 2035: This new report from the Center for Strategic & International Studies aims to present a clear picture of the economy Beijing wants to build by 2035 and develop potential scenarios for how this might unfold in reality—as well as explore the implications for U.S. policymakers, the U.S. economy, and other Western countries. The report focuses, in particular, on how China's approach to managing the challenges of debt, demography, and deglobalization might shape its economic trajectory.

Trump's Tariff Revenue Tracker: Gary Clyde Hufbauer and Ye Zhang of the Peterson Institute for International Economics have <u>charted tariff revenues</u> in practice over time: How much tariff revenue is the US collecting on different products?; How much tariff revenue is the US collecting on different countries' goods?; Can Trump's tariff revenues help pay for the federal budget deficit?

The Global Sourcing Risk Index 2025: Developed in collaboration with Oxford Economics, The Global Sourcing Risk Index analyzes the top 20 global economies, plus 10 fast-emerging economies, against 10 key sectors and eight risk dimensions: Geopolitical Conflict, Climate, Governance, Control, and Compliance, Human Rights, Trade Barriers, Labor Cost Volatility, Input Cost Volatility, and Supplier Concentration. The Index offers a strategic view of high-risk country-sector pairings across each of the risks, and how procurement leaders can respond with clarity and control.
