## Of Note:

**USTR Proposes New Tariffs on 60 Countries:** As widely reported, the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative released a [report](#) yesterday announcing its findings from a Section 301 investigation into 60 trading partners and their practices related to forced labor. USTR has published a [Federal Register notice](#) outlining its proposed actions in full and is requesting public comments. The written comment period is open until **July 6, 2026**.

**USTR Seeks Comments on a Mechanism to Promote Reciprocal Managed Trade with China:** The Office of the U.S. Trade Representative is [soliciting comments](#) on the types of non-sensitive products that would benefit from favorable tariff modifications by both sides, and considerations around the design of a new government-to-government mechanism—a U.S.-China Board of Trade—to manage bilateral trade optimization on an ongoing basis. The written comment period is open until **July 10, 2026**.

**Ambassador Jamieson Greer: Trade Theory Must Catch up with Tariffs, Industrial Policy, and the Costs of Globalization:** This is the [full text](#) of an article USTR Greer published in the June issue of the International Monetary Fund's *Finance & Development* Magazine calling for the economics profession to revisit its assumptions and develop models that capture what matters to the real economy—including distributional consequences of trade, labor market dynamics, network and scale effects in manufacturing, effects of regulatory arbitrage on workers and producers, impacts of detailed rules of origin on global production networks, and public health outcomes.

**831 Data Centers Are under Construction in the United States:** The [Progressive Policy Institute](#)'s Ed Gresser reveals the latest data on data centers: McKinsey [estimates](#) \$7 trillion going into data centers over the next five years, with 40% of it spent in the United States; UNCTAD says data center-building accounted for [a fifth](#) of the \$1.6 trillion in “greenfield” FDI investment last year; [DataCenterMap](#), which counts the number of actually operating data centers, reports 11,534 live worldwide, including 4,312 in the United States, and Bloomberg NEF says Americans are building [831 new ones](#).

**Box Rates Soar \$1,000 in One Week on Peak Rush:** Ocean container rates on major east-west trade lanes that held steady a week ago spiked by at least \$1,000 per forty-foot equivalent unit (FEU) on rate hikes and surcharges that took effect June 1, reports [Freight Waves](#). The ongoing closure to most global shipping of the Strait of Hormuz by Iran has kept container rates elevated but below spiking level, said analyst Freightos, through fuel cost increases.

**Ramping up Manufacturing in America?:** The United States relies heavily on imported manufactured goods—\$3 trillion annually—and a significant share of these imports pose strategic vulnerabilities. McKinsey analyzes what it would take to “ramp up” domestic manufacturing to reduce these dependencies. The U.S. can reduce some import dependence by using existing capacity, but the most critical vulnerabilities—electronics, pharmaceuticals, advanced materials—require massive new investment, new skills, and new industrial strategies. ### **White House Issues New Executive Order to Strengthen Customs Enforcement, Protecting U.S.**

**Consumers and Businesses:** In a statement released on June 3, [CBP references](#) President Trump's signed Executive Order “[Strengthening Customs Enforcement](#),” empowering U.S. Customs and Border Protection with a comprehensive set of tools to safeguard American consumers, businesses, and revenue while increasing transparency and compliance across international supply chains.

**The Rise of the Tariff-Optimized Supply Chain: Inside the New Rules of Global Trade:** The tariff environment that emerged in 2025 restructured modern U.S. trade. Duty brackets that didn't exist in 2024 suddenly held tens of thousands of entries. Three patterns defined the tariff-optimized supply chain: Transport mode became a tariff decision; Tariff exposure shifted from a fixed cost to a managed variable; Trade routes became an early-warning system. **Ranked: America's Biggest Industries by Economic Output:** According to the [Visual Capitalist](#) and the [Bureau of Economic Analysis](#), the U.S. economy generated \$31.4 trillion in GDP in 2025, making it the largest economy in the world. Finance, real estate, insurance, rental, and leasing led all industries at \$6.8 trillion in output, accounting for more than one-fifth of the entire economy.

**Regional Economic Prospects – June 2026:** This report, published by the European Bank for Reconstruction & Development ([EBRD](#)), provides an analysis of economic prospects, risks, and policy responses in the EBRD regions as of June 2026, highlighting growth forecasts, inflation, energy shocks and geopolitical impacts.

**Monitoring Global Trade by Products, Using Big Data:** This [OECD Working Paper](#) develops a novel methodology to derive timely, experimental estimates of trade by commodity with global coverage using messages from the Automatic Identification System (AIS). By transforming high-frequency vessel movements into trade proxies, the approach makes it possible to monitor global cross-border flows in near real time for 23 commodity groups worldwide, covering 97.8% of existing berths across 3534 ports.

**The Top 100 Countries for Foreign Investment:** This graphic from [Visual Capitalist](#) ranks the top 100 countries for foreign investment in 2024, based on foreign direct investment inflows tracked by UN Trade and Development. U.S. FDI inflows in 2024 reached almost \$279 billion; Singapore ranked second with roughly \$143 billion in inflows, while Hong Kong and China followed closely behind.

**The Panama Canal & Mexico’s Interoceanic Corridor of the Isthmus of Tehuantepec (CIIT):** Mexico may have a commercially viable alternative to the Panama Canal becoming fully operational by June 2026, writes [Barnes Richardson’s](#) Pietro Bianchi. The CIIT is described as a multimodal “dry canal.” It involves modern ports on the Pacific and Gulf coasts and three main rail lines. Mexico is also building a pipeline and refineries parallel to the rail lines. This energy infrastructure is being built primarily to supply the needs of the industrial corridor and also for LNG exports.

**Atlas of Global Development 2026:** Across the global development landscape, which countries are moving the fastest, and which are losing ground? The 2026 edition of the [World Bank’s](#) *Atlas of Global Development* puts progress at its center. Looking at how fast countries are moving toward better outcomes and facing different challenges, from their own individual starting points, this edition introduces a new framework to track development over the past 75 years, revealing how countries have advanced across key dimensions.

**The 2026 Kearney FDI Confidence Index®: World Recalibrating:** Kearney’s Global Business Policy Council’s [latest research](#) reveals a global investment landscape in transition, where confidence remains strong, but decision-making is becoming far more selective. Despite rising geopolitical tensions and policy complexity, 88 percent of global executives still plan to increase foreign direct investment over the next three years.

**The fDi Report 2026:** *FT Locations* has just released (May 6) this [report](#), documenting how digital technologies are redrawing the global FDI map. The ICT and electronic cluster accounted for more than 40 per cent of global greenfield FDI in 2025. This new wave of FDI comes with distinctive features: capital intensive, concentrated, and still able to generate jobs.
