Of Note:

Complete List of U.S. Products Subject to Counter Tariffs: As a result of the U.S.'s decision to impose a 50 per cent tariff on \$27.6 billion of Canadian goods effective August 22, 2026, the Prime Minister announced that Canada will match the incoming U.S. Section 338 tariffs – dollar for dollar. These new countermeasures on \$27.6 billion in products imported from the U.S. will be effective as of 12:01 a.m., September 8, 2026. The updated list is [here](#).

U.S. Tariff Collection on Hockey Pads, Helmets, Sticks, Pucks & Pads: As part of an article condemning the Administration's new 50% tariffs on Canadian goods, the [Progressive Policy Institute](#) outlines the typical expenses for hockey gear (usually tariff-free until now): \$200 for skates; \$70 for a college-quality carbon-fiber stick; \$200 for pads; \$100 for gloves; \$30 for a bucket of pucks, more for goalies. Rink managers, meanwhile, need expensive machinery to smooth their ice (a Zamboni machine runs from \$125,000 to \$180,000), keep air circulating at the right temperature, and sharpen players' skates before games. This means teams have to defray ice-time costs through fees, typically ranging from \$400 - \$1,000 per player. So at face value, the article concludes, *[the new 50% tariff] will cost American hockey parents and athletic departments about \$12 million.*

Four in 10 Canadian Manufacturers Eye U.S. Production Move: One year after manufacturers warned that U.S. tariffs posed an existential threat to their businesses, a new [KPMG survey](#) finds four in 10 manufacturers have moved production to the U.S. or are considering doing so as they adapt to ongoing trade uncertainty and mounting competitive pressures. The survey of 275 manufacturers finds that 57 per cent say they have paused, reduced or cancelled capital expenditure projects due to economic uncertainty and trade and tariff threats, while 42 per cent have scaled back or paused research and development spending.

Ranked: Which Countries Hold the Most U.S. Debt?: The U.S. national debt has surpassed \$40 trillion, with foreign investors holding trillions of dollars in Treasury securities. This visualization, by [Visual Capitalist](#), ranks the 20 largest foreign holders of U.S. debt based on June 2026 data from the [U.S. Treasury Department](#). Japan is the largest foreign holder of U.S. Treasuries, with \$1.1 trillion. China now ranks third with \$633 billion,

The \$150 Trillion Global Economy in 2030: [Visual Capitalist](#) shows countries' projected nominal gross domestic product (GDP) in 2030, based on forecasts from the International Monetary Fund's [World Economic Outlook](#). The world economy is projected to exceed \$150 trillion by 2030, with significant growth coming from emerging markets in Asia. The U.S. (\$37.7 trillion) and China (\$26 trillion) will remain the world's largest economies by 2030, while Germany and India are projected to be virtually tied for third place.

What Super El Niño Means for Business Supply Chains and the Economy: As reported by [Forbes](#), the U.S. National Weather Service is forecasting a greater than 90% chance of a very strong El Niño event in the Northern Hemisphere this year. Additionally, there is a 69% chance that it will be the strongest event since official records began 1950. In the 1980s and 1990s, destructive El Niños left behind as much as \$4 to \$5 trillion dollars in damage per event.

Taiwan and the Pacific: Perspectives from Australia, Taiwan, and the United States on Cross-Strait Challenges and Regional Partnership: This just-released [report](#) from the Center for Strategic & International Studies chronicles the results of leading scholars and practitioners who examined pressing challenges in the Taiwan Strait and the Indo-Pacific and explored new avenues for trilateral partnership across a range of areas, including security cooperation, economic resilience, regional economic integration, and engagement with Pacific Island countries.

USMCA Joint Review Tracker: The [International Compliance Professionals Association](#) now publishes this weekly update – “what has changed, what has not, and what it means for your compliance program.” A very useful summary of recent developments and implications for the compliance environment, it is available for free.

Global Trade Tracker: The Council on Foreign Relations [Global Trade Tracker](#) allows you to gauge trends in international trade through time. Compiled from IMF trade data for 215 countries, it provides values for each country's trade in tangible goods and, for countries reporting the necessary data to the IMF, it also shows the value on their current accounts (that is, adding in services trade, payments to investors abroad, and other foreign funds transfers).

Weapons of Brass Destruction? Trump's Tariffs Target Musical Instruments as a National Security Threat: [The Peterson Institute for Global Economics](#)' Cullen S. Hendrix takes us once more down the seemingly bottomless hole of tariffs with this month's proposal to impose tariffs on imported brass wind instruments such as trombones, trumpets, and tubas as a threat to national security. “If implemented, this inclusion would harm music retailers and school music programs while opening the door to considering virtually any imported good as such a threat.”

The State of U.S. Tariffs: The [Budget Lab](#)'s August 11 update: The average statutory tariff rate now stands at 11.0%, roughly where it settled after Section 122 tariffs expired on July 24th; We estimate the ultimate consumer price impact of current-law tariff policy to be about 0.7%; Estimated household costs due to tariffs total about \$1,100 annually under current law; Over the next ten years, we estimate that current-law tariffs will raise about \$1.9 trillion.

Relief for Nigeria, Others as US Senate Extends Duty-free AGOA Trade Pact till 2028: The United States Senate has approved a two-year extension of the African Growth and Opportunity Act, AGOA, paving the way for eligible sub-Saharan African countries to continue enjoying duty-free access to the US market until December 2028, according to [allAfrica.com](#). The deal covers agricultural products, footwear, automobiles, textiles, apparel and other manufactured goods worth billions of dollars annually.

Trump's Trade War Timeline 2.0: An Up-to-date Guide: This timeline, originally published February 25, 2025, by the [Peterson Institute for International Economics](#), is updated periodically to document US trade actions during President Donald Trump's second term in office. It tracks the development of the most notable trade actions by the United States and other countries with links to the latest available data and PIIE analysis. Entries focus primarily on official government announcements and actions.

Mapped: Every U.S. State's Economy, Matched to a Country: In this [Visual Capitalist](#) rendering each U.S. state is paired with the country closest to it in nominal gross domestic product (GDP) in 2025, using data from the [Bureau of Economic Analysis](#) and the IMF's [World Economic Outlook](#). California's \$4.3 trillion economy is closest in size to the United Kingdom, while Texas' \$2.9 trillion GDP is comparable to Russia's. California, Texas, New York, and Florida would each qualify as G20-sized economies if they were independent countries.

Stagnated American Export Licensing Regime Eroding Competitiveness with China: The [U.S.-China On August 7 the Business Council](#) conducted a flash survey in July to gauge companies' experience navigating the US export licensing regime under the second Trump administration. The 31 respondents — primarily representing the technology, industrial and manufacturing, energy, and healthcare industries — painted a stark picture of licensing delays and unclear procedures, unwillingness of export control agencies to engage with industry, and unnecessarily burdensome policies and out-of-date regulations.

UNCTAD's Trade and Development Foresights 2026: As reported by the [Hinrich Foundation](#), the UN Trade and Development's (UNCTAD) report, [Trade and Development Foresights 2026: Global Economy Faces a Geopolitical Challenge](#), warns that global growth is expected to slow as the Middle East conflict disrupts energy markets, financial conditions, and shipping routes, including through the Strait of Hormuz. Rising uncertainty will weigh on trade, investment, and supply chains, with real merchandise trade growth projected to fall from 4.7% in 2025 to 1.5%–2.5% in 2026.

The World's Most Powerful Passports (2016 vs. 2026): Citing the [Henley Passport Power Index](#), this [Visual Capitalist](#) graphic compares the world's most powerful passports in 2016 and 2026, showing how the global hierarchy has changed over the past decade. Asian passports occupy the top four positions in 2026, led by Singapore (192), Japan (188), South Korea (188), and the UAE (188). The UAE has added 153 visa-free destinations over the past 20 years, one of the largest gains in global mobility.

CBP Office of Field Operations Launches New Strategy to Safeguard America's National and Economic Security: On August 6 CBP's Office of Field Operations unveiled the "[OFO Strategy 2026-2030](#)," a new roadmap that outlines how OFO will continue to safeguard U.S. travel, trade, and agriculture, directly protecting our national and economic security. The OFO Strategy focuses on four key goals to ensure continued mission excellence: *National Security; Economic Security; Integration; Workforce Cultivation*.

One of the World's Smallest Countries Has a New Name: The [New York Times](#) reports the South Pacific island of Nauru wants its name to more closely match how it is said in the language spoken by its people: [Naoero](#). That's the new name for the small South Pacific country formerly known as Nauru. Its Parliament unanimously approved the change in May and the name became official, President David Adeang said last week,

The 2026 edition of the [World Bank](#)'s *Atlas of Global Development* puts progress at its center. Looking at how fast countries are moving toward better outcomes and facing different challenges, from their own individual starting points, this edition introduces a new framework to track development over the past 75 years, revealing how countries have advanced across key dimensions.
